School: Franklin High School is one of nine comprehensive public high schools in the Elk Grove Unified School District, enrolling 2,632 students in grades 9-12. The school opened in the fall of 2002 and graduated its first senior class in the spring of 2005. Franklin High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.
