- In the spring of your Senior Year:
 - 1) Launch your Community College application through www.CaliforniaColleges.edu
 - 2) Read ALL EMAILS for the steps to complete enrollment process
 - 3) Launch your FAFSA or CADAA through www.CaliforniaColleges.edu
 - 4) Complete the Career and Academic Communities (CAC) Major Selection Form
 - 5) Schedule your Orientation (March or April)
 - 6) Enroll in classes in late April or early May

Financial Aid/Scholarships

Highlights to be aware of now:

- All Community Colleges have FREE TUITION for the first two years, but ONLY if the FAFSA is completed during the senior year. The FAFSA is open October 1st – March 2nd.
- Begin researching scholarships this summer. See the “Money, Money, Money” handout.
