 - 5) Check Math & English Placement.
 - 6) Enroll in classes.
 - 7) Register for classes and pay fees.

UC & CSU College Application Helpful Hints:



- Franklin High School is a **SEMESTER** Grading type system for completing college applications
- If applying to a CSU, complete it first, through www.californiacolleges.edu
Then use the pre-populated information as template for other college applications.
- When inputting your grades in to the application:
 - DO NOT include bridges in English 9, 10, Geometry, Algebra, Math 1 or Math 2
 - Only record A-G courses
- Senior courses need to be recorded
 - In Progress = A-G classes you are currently taking
 - Planned = A-G classes you will be taking
- There is an opportunity for you to list some non A-G courses on the application (ex: STEM coursework, Leadership, Link Crew, etc.)

CSU – LAUNCH THROUGH www.CaliforniaColleges.edu *Courses will pre-populate*

- Quarter 1 and Quarter 2 grades = Fall Semester classes (Quarters ending in Oct & Dec on transcript)
- Quarter 3 and Quarter 4 grades = Spring Semester classes (Quarters ending in March & May on transcript)
